RE: Proposed Presidential Policy on Clery Act

Dear Sandi:

The proposed Presidential Policy on Clery Act compliance was forwarded to all standing committees of the Davis Division of the Academic Senate. Responses were received from the Committee on Privilege and Tenure (Hearings and Investigative Subcommittees), the Committee on Faculty Welfare, and the Faculty Executive Committee of the College of Letters and Science.

Committees commented on a few items. The FEC of L&S recommends clarifying the following areas: reporting policies for alleged crimes versus crimes determined to have occurred; whether or not the university must provide data on which groups (such as police or a university committee) have decided if a crime has occurred; and requirements for when a university committee must alert law enforcement of a crime. Faculty Welfare recommends one editorial change for the policy: define the acronym "CARE," which is the Center for Advocacy, Resources, & Education.

Full committee comments are enclosed. The Davis Division appreciates the opportunity to comment.
