Graduate Council has a significant concern and it is raised by GSM itself: "The most significant risk associated with this project is the need to transfer data between the GSM database and Banner (SIS). If this data transfer cannot be accomplished, then significant redundant data entry may be required in each system." Data transfer between the GSM database and Banner (SIS) must be precondition for approval of deployment of the project. In the absence of assurances that this integration will be possible and will receive a high priority in the implementation, Graduate Council opposes the project.

The CIT agrees with this proposal, which documents clearly the specific needs of GSM with regard to information technology, fee payment, and student information, while at the same time coordinating with existing campus IT systems.
