The following response is submitted on behalf of Matthew Traxler, Chair of the Undergraduate Council.

This matter was discussed at the Undergraduate Council meeting on 12/4/2012. The UGC identified the following as the most pressing concerns: UGC is concerned about the possibility that admissions standards will be lowered for the group of students who will be admitted under this program. The UGC is also concerned about the possibility that admissions decisions will be made outside the normal process. The draft proposal does not clearly indicate what role CAES will play in admissions nor does it provide a strong rationale for bypassing the normal admissions procedures.
