The Information Technology Committee has reviewed the [PPM 200-45: Campus Asset Management Planning and Information System](#) and has completed the following response.

General Comments: This application is a very complex one as it seeks to join the management of a large series of physical plant functions, from building construction and maintenance to key management, cleaning of classrooms, preventive maintenance, alarm/emergency notifications, etc. It is still in the planning stages but has a user committee. It is also expected to tie in with the Kuali financial system. The next planning stage is to refine the scope of the project to 4-5 major objectives. These objectives would be best supported by clearly articulating many demonstrable use cases, their overlapping needs, and a prioritization of these needs.

Recommendation: This project can have potentially a huge impact on the management of the campus and to affect many people. We recommend that the user committee include faculty, staff, and students.
